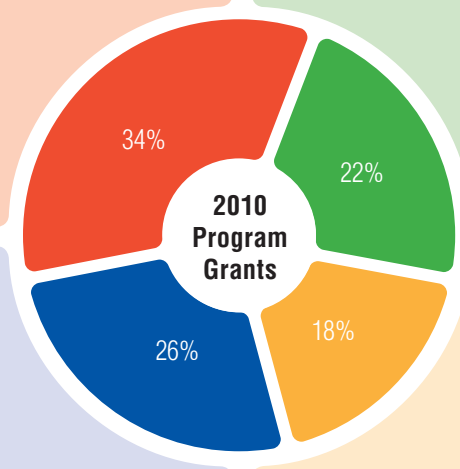
Helping Children Succeed
